


## **Copeland Funds Sector Update - February 2020**

January began with a continuation of the 4 <sup>th</sup> quarter's positive momentum in both US and foreign equities (Charts 1 and 2), but finished with a pullback in prices and a spike in volatility (Chart 3) with the emergence of the Coronavirus in China. The extent of the human and economic fallout from the rapidly spreading virus is a huge unknown variable as investors invest in early 2020. The outperformance of growth and defensive sectors, and underperformance of cyclical sectors, reflects the uncertainty that has enveloped global markets. The weakness in the energy and materials sectors reflects the determination by investors that industries dependent on Chinese demand will be significantly impacted. At Copeland we'll remain focused on the prospects for dividend growth in the companies in the portfolio, particularly within sectors of the market with positive sector signals. Both the domestic and international funds remain fully invested in equities in February, but with selective sector exposure as described more fully below.


The current bull market is now the longest since the Great Depression, reaching 130 months in length (Chart 4), even if it still ranks second in magnitude to the roaring 1990's. As always, there remains much to be concerned about, even beyond the virus, such as high valuation levels, little evidence of concern about the potential for future trade battles and a potentially game changing election in November. Still, there are also reasons to be optimistic. Economic data appears to be stabilizing for many economies around the world and the recent "industrial recession" may have run its course. Employment is high and improving and inflation is non-existent, while central banks have been supportive with monetary policy. The Funds are positioned to benefit in the near run if optimism continues, fully invested in high quality dividend growth stocks, but prepared to act tactically to raise cash if pessimism resumes and signs of weakness in the market do eventually unfold.

<u>Copeland Risk Managed Dividend Growth Fund (CDGRX)</u> ~ On a total return basis, the Fund returned  $\pm 1.1\%$  in January 2020, outerforming the S&P 500® Index which was flat. Stock selection in Industrials and Financials were the primary drivers of performance. The strategy was aided by an overweight in the positively ranked Utilities sector, which led the market this month with a  $\pm 6.7\%$  return. Also retaining a positive sector signal was the Technology sector, which continued its strong performance with a  $\pm 3.9\%$  month. The negatively ranked Materials and Energy sectors were the laggards this month, down 6% and 11% for the month, as they are expected to be most sensitive to the Chinese economic fallout from the rapidly spreading Coronavirus. Underweight positions to these sectors also aided performance.

The Health Care sector turned positive at the end of January resulting in additional positions being purchased for that sector. The positively ranked sectors are now Industrials, Technology, Health Care, Financials/REITs and Utilities where the strategy will retain overweight exposure vs. the benchmark. The four negatively rated sectors will be underweighted vs. the benchmark. With five sectors positive, the strategy will be 100% invested in dividend growth equities in February. The sector targets at present are approximately as follows: Technology (24%), Financials/REITs (22%), Industrials (16%), Health Care (16%), Utilities (7%), Consumer Staples (6%), Consumer Discretionary (5%), Energy (2%), Materials (1%) and Cash (0%).

Low volatility: due to the previous defensive sector positioning, cash levels

and ownership of dividend growth stocks, the strategy has produced less volatility over the last five years than the benchmark. During the trailing five year period as of 1/31/20, beta was only 0.5 and the strategy's standard deviation (volatility) was 8.7% vs. the S&P 500 Index at 11.9%.

## CDGRX

<u>Copeland International Risk Managed Dividend Growth Fund (IDVGX)</u>  $\sim$ The Fund's -1.6% return outperformed the MSCI World ex USA Index, which was down -1.9% in January. The overweights to Technology and Utilities and stock selection in Industrials had positive impacts on return.

There were no sector changes at the end of January, with four sectors maintaining positive signals: Industrials, Technology, Staples, and Utilities. With four sectors positive, the strategy will continue to be 100% invested in dividend growth equities in February. The sector targets at present are approximately as follows: Industrials 22%, Staples 20%, Technology 14%, Utilities 14%, Financials/REITs 11%, Health Care 6%, Discretionary 6%, Energy 3%, Materials 4%, Cash 0%.

The Fund continues to have lower risk metrics vs. the benchmark for the trailing five year period, with a beta of 0.5 and standard deviation of 8.4% vs. 12.2% for the Index.
